The Media's Toxic View On Woman

Plato's Cave and Miss Representation are two different stories that have a lot in common like the fact that they show us the world in a new way a lot of people have never seen before, but when we try to tell others it doesn't work. Plato's Cave are similar to the themes in Miss Representation, because media limits content so teenage girls see skinny models not ones of all sizes, we see woman who stay home and men who work because the men want it that way, and we see controlling wives and stupid husbands. These things are a bad message for young girls and it needs to be stopped.

Miss Representation Discussion

Miss Representation, a film made in 2011, talks about how women are shown in the media, as object not people. It's truly disgusting how little woman in power or woman as main characters there are. And also how many woman are in a position of state. In this film it states, "Women make up 17% of congress." which is not a lot at all. It also says, "67 countries in the world have had female presidents or prime ministers. The United States is not one of them. Cuba, China, Iraq and Afghanistan have more women in government than the US does." All of these states that we think we're better then have adapted to women rights better then we have. It also states, "Only 16% of protagonists in film are female. Only 7% of film directors and 10% of

writers are female.” That is even less than the women in political careers. “Between 1937 and 2005 there were only 13 female protagonists in animated movies. The female characters in G rated movies are just as likely to wear revealing clothing as in R rated movies.” There should not be any nudity in G rated films let alone more than a R rated movie G is for families not for nudity. . It also talks about how young girls are affected by the models they see. It also states “53% of 12 year old girls feel unhappy with their bodies, 78% of 17 year old girls feel unhappy with their bodies and 65% of women and girls have an eating disorder.” Those numbers are more than half this is a problem we should be addressing.

Plato’s Cave Discussion

Plato’s Cave is a story that was told to Plato by his teacher Socrates and this story was about men who were restrained with chains to only look at the walls of the cave they were chained to, behind the men was a fire that burned because of that they could see the reflection of the people who passed by them. So all they could see was the shadows that the restrainer allowed them to see. One day one of the men was let free and experienced the world outside of the cave for the first time. Thin Models

Having only thin models being shown to us makes young girls think that they should also look like that and when they don’t they hurt themselves or they have eating disorders which is

horrible that they have to go through this. “The fashion industry has bestowed on us all manner of treats. Racists, misogynists, homophobes, fattists, just for starters.” (News Website). This quote is to true how often do you see adversity in modeling or really any news, not often. Nevertheless to become a model a lot of the time you have to be a ridiculous height have can’t have marks on your body just weigh so much it’s unrealistic. “Feminists concerned about objectification. Psychologists worried about unattainable beauty benchmarks. Whingey mothers confident that the industry will somehow convince their daughters to spread their legs.” (News Website). A lot of women nowadays are being treated as objects and they think they can dress them however they want but that is not a good message for the young girls who are watching them. “Be between the ages of 18 and 30 (yes, it’s okay to be a little “older”), Be healthy and in great shape, Have a slim build, yet be slightly more voluptuous than a typical runway model (34-24-34, give or take an inch, is the industry standard), Be between 5’8” and 6’0” (The Balance Careers Website). I found this article all about how to become a Victoria’s Secret model. It is unreal what they want a woman to look like in order to model for them I know about 3 women in my lifetime who were 5’8 or above and to be that skinny. And they don’t really want them if they’re over 30 that is a young age. And the young children who only see these body types they don’t necessarily know there is other body types much like in Plato’s Cave when the men who can only see the cave wall don’t know there is a whole world outside because nobody told them they didn’t get to explore it same as these girls.

Stay at home women and working husbands

The percentage of women being stay at home parents is higher than the percentage of men being stay at home parents. So why is that? In the 1950s it was because the men wanted the

Well that’s not always how it is anymore but a lot of people and the media think it is. “As Michelle Haimoff pointed out recently in the Christian Science Monitor, in TV’s five top rated shows: “The Big Bang Theory, Modern Family, Two Broke Girls, Two and a Half Men, and How I Met Your Mother—the majority of the male characters are professionally accomplished, while the female characters are almost all unemployed or financially struggling.” (Role Reboot Website). It’s time for a change. “There are some TV shows with working women and some, like Up All Night, that feature stay-at-home dads, but not among the top ranked. We aren’t really on a first TV-name basis with working women anymore. Remember Claire Huxtable? Murphy Brown? Mary Tyler Moore? Roseanne? Kate and Allie? Women like these are hard to find on television today.” (Role Reboot Website). This quote shows you the actors and actresses we like to see people like to see Roseanne and on tv especially on her show but we also like to see strong female leads.
